Simon Jeruchim

Simon Jeruchim was born in Paris in 1929. In July



1942, Simon's family escaped from a major police roundup. A compassionate gentile couple found separate hiding places for him and his siblings in the countryside of Normandy.

In the fall of 1942, his parents tried to escape to the non-occupied zone but were arrested by the French police and turned over to the Nazis, deported to Auschwitz and perished. Simon spent almost two years in Normandy. There, a schoolmaster gave him a gift consisting of watercolors and a sketchpad and there his love of art began. Simon is the author of two books, 'Hidden in France', and 'Frenchy' and continues to create and display his artwork today.
